TOWN OPERATIONS ALTERED BY ICE

WAKE FOREST, NC – January 11, 2011 – Following last night's pelting of ice and snow, Wake Forest road crews are out today targeting the town's main roads, bridges, hills, and historically icy spots with sand and salt.

Road crews concentrate on thoroughfares, primary roads in subdivisions, followed by thru-streets in subdivisions and then cul-de-sacs. The Town does not clear private parking lots, including those in apartment complexes or at businesses.

On Monday, Town crews applied brine throughout the community. Wake Forest has 28 tons of sand/salt mix supply available, if needed, along with an additional 175 tons of pure salt. Also, the Town has six plows available to clear Wake Forest's 56 miles of roads.

Traffic Update

- There have been two storm-related traffic accidents reported thus far in Wake Forest. Police are urging drivers to stay off the roads for their own safety, and be extra cautious if they must go out.

Sanitation Service

- Garbage and recycling are not being collected today. Crews will resume collections tomorrow beginning with Tuesday's route. Garbage and recycling pickups will be pushed back one day for the remainder of the week with collections scheduled for Wednesday through Saturday. Bulk waste pickup will be on Wednesday. Openings and Closings

- Town Hall is open on a regular schedule: 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.
- All Parks and Recreation Department classes scheduled for today and tonight have been cancelled. All basketball practices have also been cancelled. The Flaherty Park Community Center will be closed today.

- Wake Forest bus service, including the Wake Forest-Raleigh Express and the Wake Forest Loop, is operating according to its normal schedule.
- For updates about Town operations, including changes to the sanitation schedule and parks, recreation, and cultural program cancellations, call the Weather Line at (919) 435-9569 or visit www.wakeforestnc.gov/winterweather.aspx.

Citizens are also reminded of the following tips during inclement weather:

- Do not park on streets so that plows and other Town equipment can service the area.
- Do not attempt to deal with downed limbs or trees on streets or sidewalks as they may be tangled in live power lines. Instead, call the Public Works Department at (919) 435-9570. After 4 p.m., call (919) 554-6724.
- Do not call 911 unless there is an immediate threat to life, health, or property. All non-emergency snow calls should be placed to (919) 554-6150; customer service representatives will be staffing the phones during regular business hours, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.
- Be neighborly. Check on neighbors to make sure that everyone is OK.
- Stay indoors during severe winter weather. If you do decide to venture out - whether walking or driving - let folks know when and where you are going so they can contact emergency officials should you fail to reach your destination. Take a cell phone just in case.
