OPENINGS REMAIN ON THREE ADVISORY BOARDS

WAKE FOREST, NC – May 3, 2011 – You can make a difference in our community by applying for one of the remaining vacancies on the Recreation Advisory Board, Historic Preservation Commission, and Board of Adjustment. These advisory boards were established to give residents input into what happens in the community and to advise the Board of Commissioners on matters that affect them and their town government.

The Recreation Advisory Board and Board of Adjustment each have one opening. Recreation Advisory Board applicants may live inside or outside the Town's jurisdiction. Only applicants living inside the Town's extra-territorial jurisdiction (ETJ) are eligible to fill the Board of Adjustment seat.

There are two openings on the Historic Preservation Commission. One of the selected candidates must reside in one of the town's historic districts and the other must live inside the Wake Forest zoning district.

Completed applications are being accepted through Tuesday, May 31, and may be mailed or delivered to the Wake Forest Town Hall, Attention: Town Clerk, 301 S. Brooks St., Wake Forest, NC 27587, or faxed to (919) 435-9419.

Applicants will be invited to introduce themselves to the Board of Commissioners during an upcoming work session. The board will then announce its appointments during a regular monthly meeting.

Selected applicants will volunteer for three-year terms, except where unexpired terms are being filled, and advise the Board on a variety of topics relating to the Wake Forest community.
