



TRANSIT SERVICE TO BEGIN IN WAKE FOREST ON JULY 7

Research Triangle Park, N.C. (July 1, 2008) - Transit service is coming to Wake Forest. Starting Monday, July 7th, residents will be able to ride a weekday rush-hour express from the town to downtown Raleigh and use a local circulator service that will serve the Town and provide access to grocery stores, shopping and other services.

The two new routes are a partnership of Triangle Transit, the Town of Wake Forest and the City of Raleigh. The express route will be operated by CAT - Capital Area Transit. The local circulator will be operated by Triangle Transit.

The first route, the Wake Forest-Raleigh Express will serve a new Park and Ride at White Street at Elm Avenue in Wake Forest, the Triangle Town Center Park-and-Ride at Orvis, State Government, and the Moore Square Transit Station during rush hour. During the midday, service is only provided between downtown Wake Forest and Triangle Town Center with timed transfers to CAT Route 1 throughout the day.

To help kick-off the service, the Wake Forest-Raleigh Express will be **fare free** from July 7 through July 18th. After July 18th, the express fare is \$2.50 each way in rush hours and \$2.00 each way in midday. The second route, called the Wake Forest Loop, will be a local circulator for residents wanting to travel within Wake Forest and a portion of the Wakefield community. The Wake Forest Loop will serve the Park and Ride at White Street and Elm Avenue for those riders wanting to connect with the Wake Forest-Raleigh Express in rush hours and with Triangle Town Center in midday.

The Wake Forest Loop will be **fare free** through December 31, 2008.

In addition to the local route, ADA Paratransit (door to door service) will be provided for eligible

persons with disabilities whose trips originate within 3/4 miles of the Wake Forest Loop and end within the service areas of Triangle Transit and the City of Raleigh.
