BEWARE OF PHONE SOLICITATIONS

WAKE FOREST, NC – September 24, 2009 – The [Wake Forest Police Department](#) has recently fielded calls from area citizens who were contacted by police charities soliciting donations over the phone. The telephone solicitors imply they are raising money for local police programs.

Although a number of legitimate charities solicit phone donations, the Wake Forest Police Department does not solicit contributions by phone, mail, e-mail, or door-to-door.

The police department raises money for its annual Shop-with-a-Cop program by sponsoring several fundraisers each year. The police department also accepts personal donations from area citizens but never solicits donations over the telephone. The Wake Forest Police Department urges residents and businesses to beware of unsubstantiated solicitation efforts and to take precautions to ensure your generous donation achieves the purpose you intended.

The following guidelines are provided to assist you in determining if the organization soliciting your support is legitimate:

- Request the full name of the organization/association;
- Ask questions about their purpose for fundraising and determine who specifically will benefit from your donation. The solicitor must also provide, if you request, the percentage of donation that goes to the charitable cause.
- Watch out for similar sounding names. Scam artists often try to take advantage of names that sound or look like those of respected, legitimate charities.
- Do not donate to telephone solicitors. Instead, choose a charity you support and donate directly to the charity. Many "charity" telephone solicitors keep as much as 85% of your donation as their fundraising fee. Some are simply fraudulent and not connected with a charity at all. They keep all of the money you give.

- If the telephone solicitor uses abusive or rude language or makes numerous telephone calls after being rejected, call the Wake Forest Police Department at (919) 554-6150 and file a police report;
- Use your best judgment. If you have doubts, donate to organizations that you know and trust.
