### **HISTORIC PRESERVATION WORKSHOP JAN. 12**

**WAKE FOREST, NC – January 4, 2012** – The Wake Forest Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) is inviting area residents to offer their input on the future of the Town's historic preservation efforts during a special public meeting on Thursday, Jan. 12. The workshop is scheduled from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. at the Ledford Center, 113 N. Wingate St., located on the campus of Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary. Light refreshments will be served beginning at 6:45 p.m.

The meeting will focus on how Wake Forest can continue to grow and prosper while preserving the historic character and charm of the community. Professional planning consultant Glenn R. Harbeck, AICP, will facilitate the session. Harbeck was instrumental in the development of the Town's Community Plan which was formally adopted in 2009.
