

# Wake Forest Board of Commissioners Work Session Meeting Minutes

The Wake Forest Board of Commissioners met on **Tuesday**, **December 5**, **2023**, at **6:00 p.m.** in the Board Room at Wake Forest Town Hall, 301 S Brooks Street.

Mayor Jones called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

### 1. Presentations

1.1 Presentation on the Town of Wake Forest Affordable Housing Land Disposition Program Policy

Long Range Planning Manager Brad West provided a brief overview of the Land Disposition Program stating it was an important item that was called out in their 2022 Housing Affordability Plan.

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Principal Sherry Okun-Rudnak with BAE Urban Economics provided a high-level overview of the Affordable Housing Land Disposition Program Policy and reviewed the area median income limits, affordable rents, and sales price targets.

Principal Mary Burkholder with BAE Urban Economics reviewed program highlights of neighboring cities and towns.

Ms. Rudnak reviewed feedback received at the Board's work session in June 2023 including land disposition program recommendations and area median income limits.

Commissioner Dyer asked if the area median income limits include utilities. Ms. Rudnak replied the \$1400 does include utilities but the \$1846 does not.

Commissioner Sary had some questions about the annual cost of \$600,000. Ms. Rudnak explained that the breakdown of the cost is mentioned in the report. She further elaborated that the cost has three components which include a full-time mid-level staff member, the cost of an acre of land, and consultant expertise, and that would be for one mid-sized project per year.

Commissioner Sary had questions about staffing and asked if it would become a new department or if it would fall underneath another department. Ms. Rudnak stated it's usually within Community Development. Ms. Rudnak explained if you're doing one project a year, she thinks a coordinator would be busy, but she doesn't think it becomes an entire department with staff.

Mayor Jones requested clarification regarding the Town's obligation to strongly support the Wake County Housing Authority's process as stated in the report. Ms. Rudnak replied that the Town would contribute some funding if they partnered with them.

Mayor Jones shared that a half-cent of the town's sales tax is allocated towards affordable housing. Finance Director Samantha Sanchez confirmed that it amounts to \$400,000 per year.

Mayor Jones asked if the Board had any other questions. No further questions were heard.

Assistant Town Manager Allison Snyder spoke on behalf of the Engineering Department and stated they have a contract amendment for Kimley-Horn to start the design services for Miller Park. Ms. Snyder stated it's coming before the Board because of the Town's purchasing policy due to the funds associated with the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

Mayor Jones asked how long it would take to complete the work. Ms. Snyder stated that this particular phase of developing construction drawings would take nine months and then construction of the phase would be complete within the ARPA window, which is by the end of 2025.
