
Daylight Saving Time ends Nov. 4 » Remember to set your clocks back one hour and change the batteries in your smoke detectors.




Letters for Santa

Tune in to WFTV 10 to stay informed about town activities



Wake Forest TV 10 (WFTV 10) is the Town of Wake Forest's television channel serving the residents of Wake Forest. The channel offers live coverage of board of commissioners and planning board meetings as well as shows about Town programs and events.

View on TV. Spectrum Cable TV subscribers can tune in to WFTV 10 on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:30 p.m. for live broadcasts of Joint Public Hearings and Planning Board meetings. These meetings are then re-broadcast daily the following two weeks at 9 a.m., 3 p.m., and 9 p.m.

Board of commissioners meetings are broadcast live on the third Tuesday of each month at 7 p.m. and re-broadcast daily throughout the remainder of the month at 9 a.m., 3 p.m., and 9 p.m.

View online. WFTV 10 is also provided online in real-time streaming video. So, if you're not a Spectrum Cable TV subscriber, you can still watch planning board and board of commissioners meetings (both live and rebroadcast) in streaming video on the WFTV 10 page of the Town's website.

WFTV 10 operates 24 hours per day. The information channel is produced by the Town of Wake Forest Communications Department.

PRCR Department earns national accreditation



The PRCR Department has joined the ranks of elite parks and recreation agencies across the country by earning accreditation through the Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA) and the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA). This distinguished accomplishment was awarded during the 2018 NRPA Annual Conference in Indianapolis, Indiana in September.

CAPRA accreditation is a measure of an agency's overall quality of operation, management and service to the community. Although there are approximately 12,000 parks and recreation departments throughout the United States, only 178 have attained CAPRA accreditation.

Best ways to outsmart “porch pirates”

The Wake Forest Police Department is warning homeowners to be vigilant when they have parcels delivered to their homes. Police say thieves often follow courier trucks and immediately steal items after they are dropped off. The police department offers these tips:



- **Require a package signature.** If your signature is required, couriers will not leave packages on your doorstep unattended.
- **Deliver packages to your workplace.**
- **Sign up for delivery service notifications.** You will get an alert when a package is set to be delivered allowing you to make arrangements for someone to be home when it will arrive.
- **Subscribe to a secure mailbox service.** Sign up for a PO Box at the post office or at the UPS Store. You can have all packages delivered to these locations.
- **Be a good neighbor.** Be alert and report all crime and suspicious activity. If you see a package being stolen from a neighbor’s home, call 911 and report a “crime in progress.” In addition, if you see someone acting suspicious or a vehicle that might be casing the neighborhood, call police immediately.

Loose leaf collection is underway

The Town of Wake Forest’s annual loose leaf collection program is underway and will continue through early March.

Residents are urged to adhere to the following guidelines:

- Rake leaves into piles behind the curb, so they do not interfere with traffic or drainage.
- Do not mix sticks, rocks, pine cones, limbs or other debris with loose leaves. The Town’s vacuum equipment is only designed to pick up loose leaves. Your cooperation will help prevent mechanical breakdowns and collection delays.
- Place limbs and brush behind the curb in a pile separate from leaves. Limbs and brush larger than one inch but smaller than six inches in diameter must be no longer than six feet. Limbs and logs larger than six inches in diameter must not exceed two feet in length. Logs must not exceed 10 inches in diameter.
- Keep brush away from other objects such as fences, walls, water meters, utility poles, mailboxes, fire hydrants and cars.
- Keep debris free of animal waste. Animal waste should be bagged and placed in rollout garbage carts.



Wake Forest residents can track the progress of leaf collection crews by calling the Leaf Collection Hotline at 919-435-9582. The hotline is updated each weekday morning by 8 a.m. with information concerning where crews will be working that day.

Loose leaf collection ends Friday, March 8, 2019. Beginning Monday, March 11, all leaves and grass must be bagged for collection.

Participants in Gobblequest are challenged to search for hidden cardboard turkeys throughout


