## Ailey Young House Park Plan Open House


Join the Town of Wake Forest Historic Preservation and Planning staff at the Alston-Massenburg Center (416 N. Taylor St) on **June 26 from 5:30-7:30pm** for a drop-in Open House to view the two concept plans for a park surrounding the Ailey Young House. The design consultants will showcase renderings for the two concepts and what will be included at the park. The Open House starts a month-long campaign to gather public feedback about the two concepts before a final concept plan is created for adoption.
