New Exhibit at the Wake Forest Historical Museum



The exhibit was produced by the Mountain Heritage Center at Western Carolina University. The WFHM will host an event on Sunday, July 20th at 2pm to celebrate the exhibit. Bob Plott, author and descendent of the family that bred the first Plott Hounds, will tell the story of how the breed gained worldwide notoriety as a hunting dog.
