### **Contiguous Annexation – 0 Devon Square Boulevard**

The Board unanimously approved a contiguous annexation submitted by the property owner, Town of Wake Forest, located at 0 Devon Square Boulevard being Wake County PIN 1841-28-1942 being approximately 8.25 acres.

### **Wake Forest Comprehensive Transportation Plan 2026 Amendments**

The Board unanimously approved a series of amendments to the Comprehensive Transportation Plan. The amendments account for several existing conditions updates, recommendations from recent studies and plans, and respond to changing realities on the ground that have impacted the feasibility or timing of some infrastructure projects.

### **South Franklin Street through Holding Village**

The Board heard an update on South Franklin Street through Holding Village and unanimously approved reducing from 35 to 25 mph the speed limit along the portion of South Franklin Street from Artisan Park Drive to Heritage Greens Drive.

### **Age-Friendly Community Strategic Action Plan**

The Board unanimously approved a resolution approving the adoption of the Age-Friendly Community Strategic Action Plan as presented at the Board of Commissioners work session on August 4, 2026.

### **Event Recommendations for 2027 and Beyond**

The Board unanimously approved the following changes to the 2027 events calendar:

1. Reduce the number of Friday Night on White (FNOW) events from six to four to be scheduled on the second Friday nights of April, May, September, and October.
2. Change from 5:30 p.m. to 7 p.m. the time gates will open to mark the start of the July 3 Fireworks Spectacular.
3. Combine the Wake Forest Cares Holiday Kickoff and the Lighting of Wake Forest into a single signature holiday event. Presented by Wake Forest Downtown, Inc. (WFD), the event will be scheduled on the third Saturday in November.

### **Renaissance Centre Art Exhibit**

The Board directed staff to draft a Memorandum of Understanding governing art exhibits at the Renaissance Centre, to be brought back to the Board for future review. The Board also voted 4-1 to approve and support staff's current handling of the Renaissance Centre and Wake Forest Pride's October art exhibit, with Commissioner Cross casting the dissenting vote.
