



# Town Residents ONLY - Who selected Skate Park as their MOST IMPORTANT amenity







Skatepark design is so important! Spots to sit and shady areas are essential. Some helpful thoughts:

Designs that break up large facilities into non-rectangular spaces are more attractive and help diffuse the activity into different areas of the park. This can reduce the perception of the park being overrun with skaters when it's busy, but also helps the facility look active when there are just a few people there. Perceptional management is an aspect of skatepark design many people don't immediately consider. A thoughtful approach to how the park looks with few, or lots, of people in it will help the park's long-term success and acceptance among the broader public.

Skateparks tend to have very open canopies with little shading. Consider an area that can either be shaded or an area with a cover to block the sun like the picnic pavilion idea. You could probably just have shade and a water fountain. This helps support the food truck area because that allows people to sit, eat, and drink while their kids are entertained. It will also help keep older skateboarders in the park rather than venturing away. Also note that a shaded area will be an area where people gather, so consider signs to prevent littering and include trash cans. If you are going to put picnic tables out maybe chain or bolt them to the ground because given the chance skateboarders will move and skate them if they are metal or plastic, but if they are bolted it makes it a bit of a deterrent to moving them. A restroom is kind of necessary. If you consider basketball courts know that skateboarders that do not want to be on the skate ramps will venture over to the basketball court and skate flat ground. That might result in flat bars and other skate items ending up on the courts...unless you provide an area of the skatepark where flat ground skating can occur. It seems to be okay in other communities, but most of the time this happens. Be mindful that if you require full pads (helmet, knee pads, and elbow pads) you will have lower attendance. Only requiring a helmet seems to be more accepted, but you will still have kids that do not want to wear one. Consider seeking advice from nearby towns (Apex, Raleigh, Durham, etc.) as they have built skateparks for their communities and might have lessons learned regarding materials that hold up for a long time. If you consider a pump track also know that skateboarders will probably end up there as well because they are equally fun to ride on with a skateboard. If you do intend to allow skateboarders to ride on the pump track then I think it is a great thing to add. Mountain bike trails and unpaved hiking trails seem to be the best options that will not result in people crossing over between the different areas. A few features to consider are stormwater management that can prevent erosion as this will be an impervious surface and it could help with education about water management. I'm not sure if a bus route will go to the skatepark, but that might be a way to keep skateboarders going to that location. Adding a skateboarding repair station is one idea, but usually someone at the park will have tools or you will just end your day when your board breaks. The last thing I would consider is plan the layout carefully. The bowl in Apex probably cost a consider
